

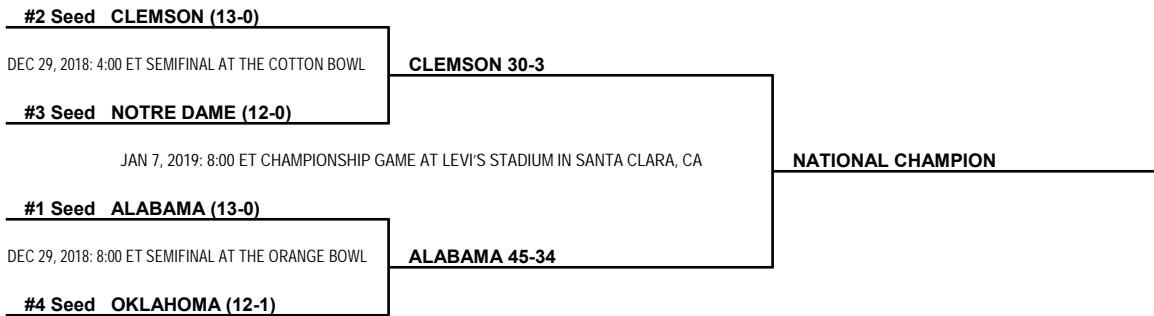

# BRAGGING RIGHTS

## TOTAL CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIPS FOR ALL 130 FBS PROGRAMS

Below, we list the all-time number of conference championships won by all 130 current NCAA Division I Football Bowl Subdivision football programs. The totals include conference championships won in defunct conferences and conferences that the schools had been affiliated with in Division I FCS, Division II and Division III. Obviously, these numbers don't necessarily demonstrate the all-time strongest programs because so many of these schools spent a majority of their years as an Independent, thus unable to win any conference championships during those times. The perfect example is the fact that Notre Dame (the ONLY schools that has NEVER spent time as a member of a conference in football) has never won a conference championship in their long storied history. The 10 schools that won conference championships in 2018 are listed in **BOLD CAPS**.
