CLEMSON WINS THE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Clemson beat Alabama 44-16 to win the 2018 College Football Playoff National Championship and capture its second national title in three years.

In doing so, the Tigers became the first team in modern college football history to finish a season 15-0 and the first overall to do so since Penn in 1897. The CFB Playoff #1 seeds continue an interesting trend of having NEVER won the national championship.

This Alabama-Clemson game began with explosive plays and a 27-point first quarter that had plenty of momentum swings, from a pick-six to long touchdowns.

In the end, the Tigers pulled away in stunning fashion as it accounted for 482 yards of total offense on just 63 plays. Quarterback Trevor Lawrence threw for 347 yards in his second postseason game. Lawrence also became the first true freshman starting quarterback to win a national championship since Oklahoma's Jamelle Holieway back in 1985.

Alabama uncharacteristically played its worst game at the worst time Tua Tagovailoa threw two bad interceptions that really hurt the Tide but the Heisman Trophy runner up, still finished with 295 yards passing. Nick Saban's decision to try a fake field goal while using his kicker as a lead blocker was ill-advised too.

Trevor Lawrence and cornerback Trayvon Mullen were named the game's most valuable players, but the real MVP was the entire Clemson defense. Defensive coordinator, Brent Venables, had a great game plan to be aggressive all game long and it paid off in the end. They disguised coverages all night long that led to a pair of interceptions as well as seven tackles for loss. Alabama averaged six yards per play, well below its average of eight that ranked second nationally. The Crimson Tide were held to 31 points below their 2018 season average as well.

Congratulations to Dabo Swinney and everyone associated with the Clemson Tigers. The future is bright at Clemson and they have now become THE team that everyone will be gunning for next season.

FOOTBALL TIDBITS

Clemson dealt Nick Saban his first loss by 21+ points since Week 15 of 2006 NFL season when his Dolphins lost to the Buffalo Bills, 21-0.

The last two major college football teams to go 15-0 in a season are the 1897 Penn Quakers and the 2018 Clemson Tigers. Yale went 16-0 in 1894. Clemson becomes the 13th program to win at least three national titles in the AP Poll era (since 1936).

Alabama had allowed one 60-yard pass play all season entering the national championship game. It's allowed two 60-yard passes to Trevor Lawrence and Clemson.

Clemson is 52-0 over the last 10 seasons when leading by 15+ points at the half. That's the most wins without a loss by any team over that span.

Alabama missed 9 extra points this season which is the most of any schools in the FBS.

Kyler Murray is the 7th player in Oklahoma history to win the Heisman Trophy, which ties Notre Dame and Ohio State for most Heisman winners.

Oklahoma's Kyler Murray was drafted 9th overall by the Oakland Athletics. Only Bo Jackson (Auburn) and Vic Janowicz (Ohio State) have ever won a Heisman trophy and played in a Major League Baseball game.

Frank Leahy (Notre Dame), Red Blaik (Army) and Woody Hayes (Ohio State) are the only coaches to produce at 3 Heisman Trophy winners. Lincoln Riley (Oklahoma) has coached 2 in just two seasons in Norman.

When Wake Forest came back to defeat Memphis in the Birmingham Bowl, they became the 2nd team in the last 15 seasons to overcome a 14-point deficit in a bowl game in consecutive seasons. The other was Texas Tech in the 2006 and 2007 seasons, led by Graham Harrell. In that same game Memphis kickoff returner, Tony Pollard just got his 7th career kickoff return TD, tying Rashaad Penny, Tyron Carrier, and C.J. Spiller for the most in DI history. Pollard also had a 41-yard Rush TD which was Memphis' FBS-leading 47th Rush TD of the season. The Tigers' 14 Rush TD of 40+ yards in 2018 are the most in a single season by any FBS team in the last 15 years.

BYU's Zach Wilson was 18 for 18 passing in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl vs Western Michigan. His 18 consecutive completions, is the second-most in a bowl game in FBS history, trailing only Georgia's Mike Bobo (19 in 1998 Outback Bowl).

Here are some interesting stats from the first five years of the playoffs:

- #1 SEEDS: 3-5 & 0 National Champions
- #2 SEEDS: 7-2 & 3 National Champions (2015 Alabama, 2016 Clemson, 2018 Clemson)
- #3 SEEDS: 1-5 & 0 National Champions
- #4 SEEDS: 4-3 & 2 National Champions (2014 Ohio State, 2017 Alabama)

The team wearing the white jersey has won the last 4 consecutive National Championship Games. For the 2014 National Championship Game, Oregon was the #3 Seed and Ohio State was the #4 Seed, but Oregon chose to wear their white jerseys in the Title Game, so Ohio State wore their scarlet jerseys when they won the National Championship and are still the only schools to win it all in their dark jerseys.

URBAN MEYER'S STATS

Urban Meyer retired following Ohio State's 28-23 victory over Washington in the Rose Bowl. Below we have listed the impressive numbers accumulated by Urban Meyer in his career. Meyer is the third-winningest coach in the history of college football (in terms of winning percentage) trailing only Knute Rockne and Frank Leahy.

Of the 84 winners of the 85 Heisman Trophies (Archie Griffin won twice), 59 played in bowl games after they received their prize (Griffin played in bowl games both years). Of those 59 players, 27 were on the winning team in the bowl. Marcus Mariota and Derrick Henry played in two bowl games after winning the Heisman with College Football National Championship occurring after the other bowl games. Houston's Andre Ware is the only Heisman recipient to miss a bowl date since 1969. The Cougars were on probation during the 1989 season and were ineligible for selection to a bowl. Before that lapse, Oklahoma's Steve Owens in 1969 was the last Heisman winner not to participate in a bowl game. Only 3 of the first 22 Heisman Trophy winners played in bowl games after receiving the award—TCU's Davey O'Brien in 1938, Georgia's Frank Sinkwich in 1942 and SMU's Doak Walker in 1948.
