THE ROAD TO MINNEAPOLIS

NCAA DIVISION I MEN'S BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT ISSUE

The 2019 NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Tournament is one of the most wide open in recent memory. Yes we have the teams out there that have been ranked high all season long like Duke, Virginia, Tennessee, Gonzaga, North Carolina, Michigan State, Kentucky, Michigan, LSU and Texas Tech but let's be honest, all ten of those schools seem very beatable. It wouldn't surprise me is the eventual NCAA Tournament champion is a 4 seed or worse which begs the question, would you rather have three or four powerhouse schools where the Final Four would be a weekend that would capture the attention of the nation. Or, would you rather have one or two favorites and two or three surprises make it to US Bank Stadium in Minneapolis?

Normally, I like having the traditional "blueblood" powerhouse programs making it to the Final Four but in 2019, I'd like to see some schools that typically don't have too much college basketball tradition make it. This season has been so much fun to watch because there have been a ton of surprises. Other than Dukes Zion Williamson, even the star

players have been somewhat surprising. A season like this doesn't happen every year so I'm excited to watch this all play out. Will we see a player make a name for himself over the next two or three weeks that we'll always remember? Let's hope so.

Speaking of Zion Williamson, I totally disagree with some of the "media experts" who believe that Zion should forgo the NCAA Tournament so as not to risk further injury to his knee. Is it possible that he could hurt his knee again? Sure, but he could also get hurt in a car crash but nobody is asking him to stop driving a car. The odds of Zion Williamson having a significant injury is very low so, yes, he should play in the NCAA Tournament. Anyone who reads The Blitz on a regular basis, knows how I feel when a player sits out a bowl game. If a player sits out game #13 in the bowl game, I say just sit out games #7, #8, #9, #10, #11 and #12 while you're at it and quit school because if you're willing to quit on your teammates in the bowl game then quit on them in the middle of the season because the bowl game does count and it is not meaningless.



Looking at the brackets, the Atlantic Coast Conference became the first league to snag 3 #1 seeds as Duke, Virginia and North Carolina were seeded #1 along with Gonzaga. That being said, the Big Ten Conference and the Southeastern Conference are also very strong leagues but as I stated above, this seems like a very wide open tournament.

Below I have listed the 16 schools that I see advancing to the Sweet 16. As much as I like Michigan State, I can't see the Spartans beating Duke in the East Region. I believe that Michigan will come out of the West Region by beating Florida State. In the South Region I believe that Tennessee will defeat Virginia to make it to their first ever Final Four and finally I like Kentucky to beat North Carolina to win the Midwest Region.

I've got Tennessee over Kentucky in an all SEC National Semi-Final and I have Duke beating Michigan in the other National Semi-Final. In my opinion, Duke just has too many athletes and will win the National Championship vs the Vols. Mike Krzyzewski will continue to add to his amazing legacy by winning another title and Zion Williamson will be named the NCAA Tournament Most Outstanding Player.

ALL-TIME NCAA DIVISION I MEN'S BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT CHAMPIONS 1939-2018

Below we list every NCAA Division I Men's National Champion since the first NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Tournament in 1939. We include the site of the championship game, the winning team along with their final W-L record, the conference they were in that season, the final score of the championship game, the runner-up as well as the other two teams that composed the Final Four from that season. We've also listed the championship game attendance as well as the total attendance from the entire tournament from that season. From 1946 thru 1981, there was a consolation game between the schools that had lost the two national semi-final games. From 1939 to 1945 and from 1982 to the present there has been no such consolation game contested and we have indicated that by placing an asterisk (*) next to those schools. These schools are considered as of having tied for third place.
